4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**


- ◆ The department will participate in the City-Wide Rummage to dispose of old office furniture, abandoned bikes, and other lost and found items.

6.) **CASES OF INTEREST**

- ◆ 05-18-15 - A local gas station owner advised there was a suspicious subject in the store and loitering in the parking lot. Upon arrival, officers located the subject passed out, leaning over the center console of a vehicle in the parking lot. The officer was able to get the subject to wake but noticed that the subject was very lethargic and had slurred speech. The subject was identified as a 26-year-old Nashotah man.
