
4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**

7.) **CASES OF INTEREST**

- ◆ 09-04-15 – A 21-year-old Hartford man reported that while he was walking in the 1300 block of E. Sumner St. he was approached by several individuals in a vehicle. Two subjects got out of the vehicle and demanded that the man give them \$10 that was owed to a mutual friend. When the man pulled out his wallet, one of the subjects grabbed the wallet while the other subject pushed the man back so he could not grab his wallet back. After the subjects had removed all of the money from the man’s wallet, they threw it back at the man and fled the area in their vehicle. Investigation into this matter lead to a charge of strong armed robbery against a 17-year-old Hartford man and charges of being a party to that crime, as well as obstructing an officer, against a 16-year-old juvenile being forwarded to the Washington County District Attorney’s Office for review and prosecution.
