2.) CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

- ◆ Completed and distributed the 2009 HPD Annual Report
- ◆ Completed Bi-Annual Staff Performance Evaluations
- ◆ Planned and facilitated new Patrol Officer Hiring Process
- ◆ Attended and presented at Police & Fire Commission Meeting regarding hiring process results
- ◆ Attended and presented at both the Finance & Personnel Meeting and the meeting of the Common Council regarding 2009 Capital Improvement Projects
- ◆ Initiated a review process of the Daily Activity Reports and the Computer Automated Dispatch System for accuracy and consistency as part of a record keeping efficiency study
- ◆ Conducted three Senior Command Staff meetings regarding the routine operations of all divisions within the department

3.) ACCOMPLISHED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES

- ◆ HPD's Nuisance Housing Abatement Program resulted in 12 evictions of problem tenants from Hartford residences for drug and other criminal activity in 2008.
- ◆ The HPD Drug Enforcement Program completed an investigation into alleged drug trafficking at a residence in the city this month. A Search Warrant was executed by Hartford Officers on January 22, 2009, and several arrests were made.

4.) ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES

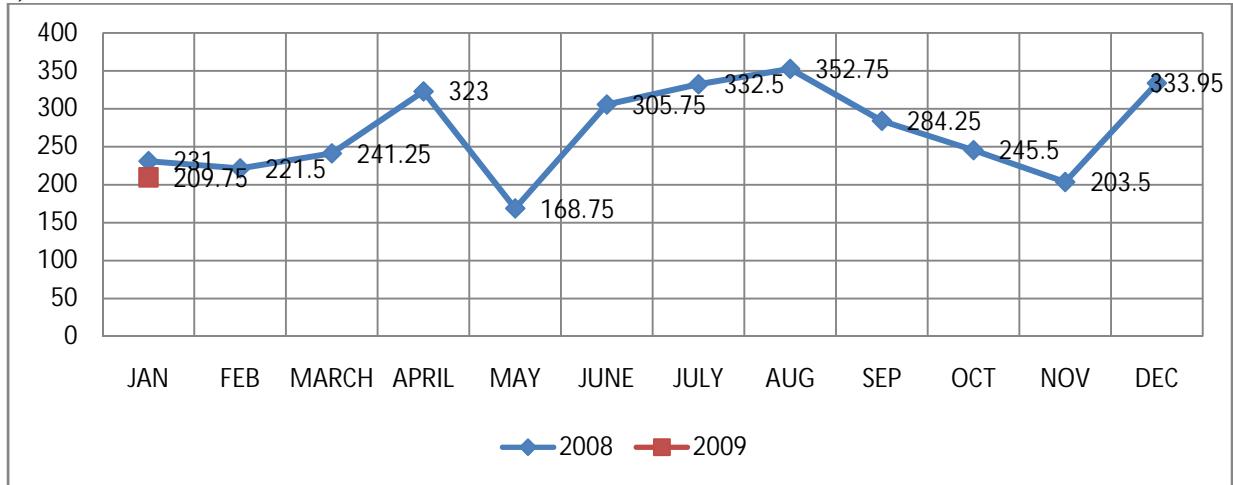
- ◆ Officer Jesse Deckert, formerly of the Watertown Police Department, will begin his career with the Hartford Police Department on February 5, 2009.

- ◆ All staff completed their certification training for the use of the new FST Preliminary breath testing units by the end of January. These units were purchased in 2008 with grants funding that was awarded to our department.

7.) **CASES OF INTEREST THIS MONTH.**

- ◆ On 01-14-09, a 17-year-old male subject was stabbed in the abdomen after a confrontation in the alleyway behind N. Main St. The investigation into this matter resulted in the arrest of a 16-year-old Hartford Juvenile. The subject told our officers that he did not intend to kill the victim, but “*just wanted to hurt him, teach him a lesson.*” The subject was charged with two felony charges of 1st Degree Reckless Injury and 1st Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety. An 18-year-old Hartford female was also arrested in the course of this investigation for misdemeanor Resisting/Obstructing an Officer after she initially confessed to the stabbing to protect the juvenile actor.
- ◆ On 01-18-09, Hartford Officers investigated a complaint of a burglary to an occupied residence. As a result of that investigation the officers developed a suspect and broadcast an attempt to locate for that individual. A short time later that individual was taken into custody by the K-9 officer from the Germantown Police Department. The 21-year-old Menomonee Falls man was found to be in possession of the items that had been stolen in the Hartford Burglary at the time of his arrest. The suspect was charged with felony Burglary, Bail Jumping, Operating after Revocation, and Unlawful Possession of Prescription Medications.
