### 4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**

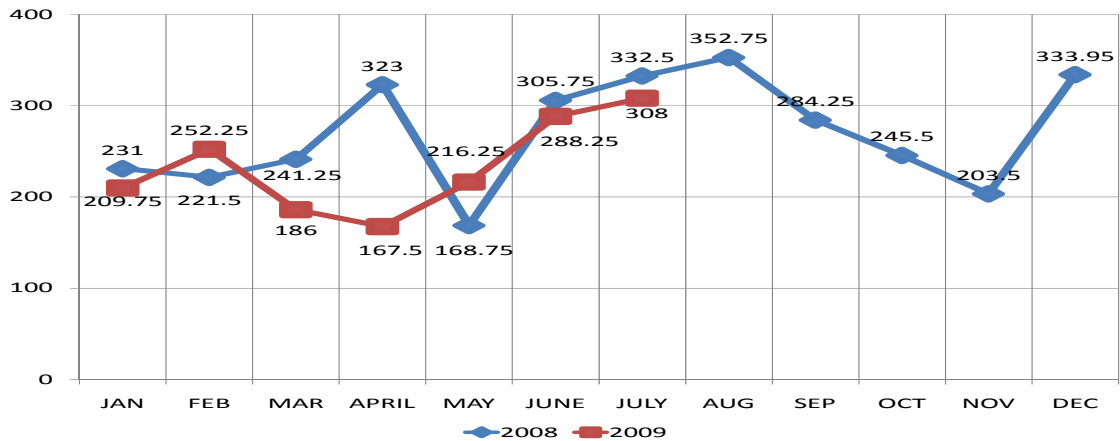
- ◆ The Hartford Explorer Post will be competeing in the Statewide Explorer Academy at Volk Field.
