- ◆ Attended and presented at the Finance and Personnel Committee

3.) ACCOMPLISHED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES

- ◆ The 2009 Hartford Police Department's Annual Citizens Academy Program held the first of eight sessions in September
- ◆ Additional equipment purchased with DOT grant funding was installed in the patrol fleet
- ◆ Our second 2009 Police Intern from WCTC joined our department. Danielle Goetsch is also one of our Explorers who is preparing herself for a career in law enforcement!
- ◆ The Hartford Police Explorers received a Presidential Award from President Barack Obama for their Community Volunteer Work in 2009. This award and the President's letter can be viewed on our website.
- ◆ The Police and Fire Commission created an Eligibility List for the position of Patrol Officer that will be in effect until December 31, 2009
- ◆ Fleet vehicle conversions were completed in September. A special thanks goes out to Lt. Lehl, our fleet coordinator, and Officer Nate Dorn. Officer Dorn handled the conversions this year and saved the department the considerable expense of having this work performed by an external vendor.



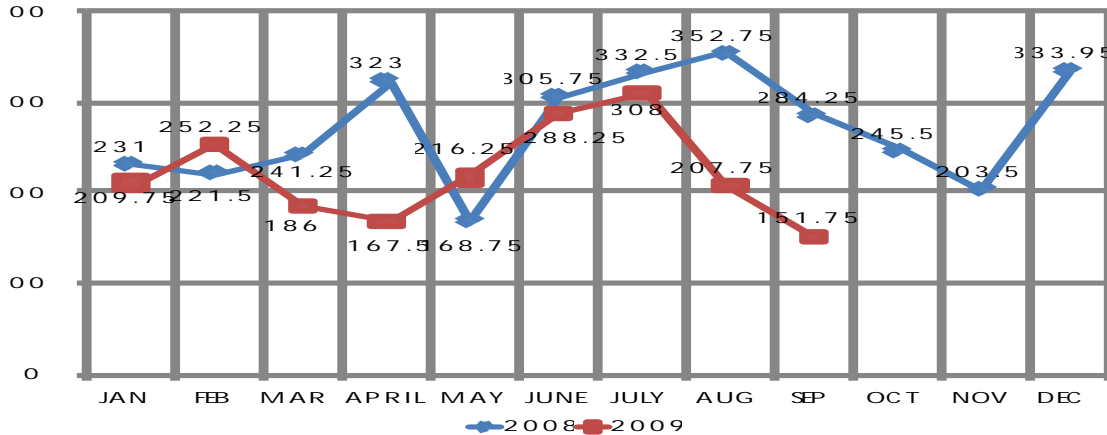
4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**

- ◆ Hartford Officers are again committed to working with our Community Partner Allison's Sentry for this year's Halloween Havoc event
- ◆ Final funding and installation of our fleet GPS program will be completed in October. This will greatly enhance officer safety by providing the Communications Center with real time location data for all of our mobile assets in the field. This project was initially planned as a CIP project, but we were able to obtain federal grant funding to cover the majority of the expense.

5.) **TRAINING**

- ◆ Sergeant Cummings attended monthly SWAT training with the Washington County Sheriff's Department
- ◆ Sergeant Cummings attended Instructor training for the planned conversion of some of our shotguns to less lethal beanbag rounds. The next phase of this implementation plan will be to convert the weapons and then provide in-house training to our staff on their use.
- ◆ Captain Horvath and Lt. MacFarlan attended a Law Enforcement Technology Conference
- ◆ Roll Call Training topics continue for the patrol staff

7.) **CASES OF INTEREST THIS MONTH.**

- ◆ 09-05-09, A felony charge of Interfering with Child Custody was filed against a 29-year-old Milwaukee man after he took his five-month-old son from a park and fled the area. A coordinated multi-jurisdictional investigation resulted in the man being located and taken into custody in the City of West Allis. The baby was returned to his mother, unharmed.
- ◆ 09-05-09, A felony charge of Possession of Child Pornography was filed against a 22-year-old Hartford man. A laptop owned by the suspect was turned in to our department after the complainant, who had permission to use it, discovered disturbing material on it. A search warrant was obtained for the suspect's residence and several additional evidentiary items were seized.
