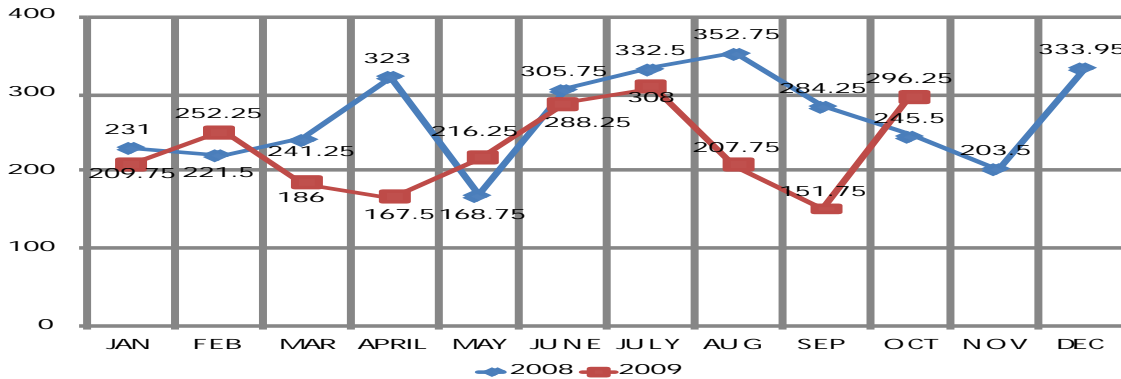
#### 4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**

#### 7.) **CASES OF INTEREST THIS MONTH.**

- ◆ 10-06-09, a 27-year-old Watertown woman was cited for theft. The woman entered the Wal-Mart store, obtained an empty cart, went to the back of the store and placed a memory foam pillow and an electric blanket into the cart. She proceeded to the Customer Service Desk and advised employees that she received these items as gifts and would like to return them. When asked why the items did not have a sticker on them, she stated the greeter was not by the door when she entered the store. The woman was provided with a Wal-Mart gift card valued at \$184.65. Security reviewed the tape and confirmed that the woman entered the store with no merchandise.
- ◆ 10-13-09, Charges of manufacture/delivery THC, possession with intent to deliver-THC, and possession of drug paraphernalia are being filed against a 19-year-old Hartford man. The man was arrested after officers witnessed a drug transaction. After further investigation, officers searched the subject's home. Officers located numerous marijuana growing items, a scale, a baggie containing 13.48 grams of marijuana, and numerous other items of drug paraphernalia. Charges from this incident have been referred to the Washington County District Attorney's Office for review and prosecution.
