- ◆ All departmental coats have been transitioned to bear new police department patches



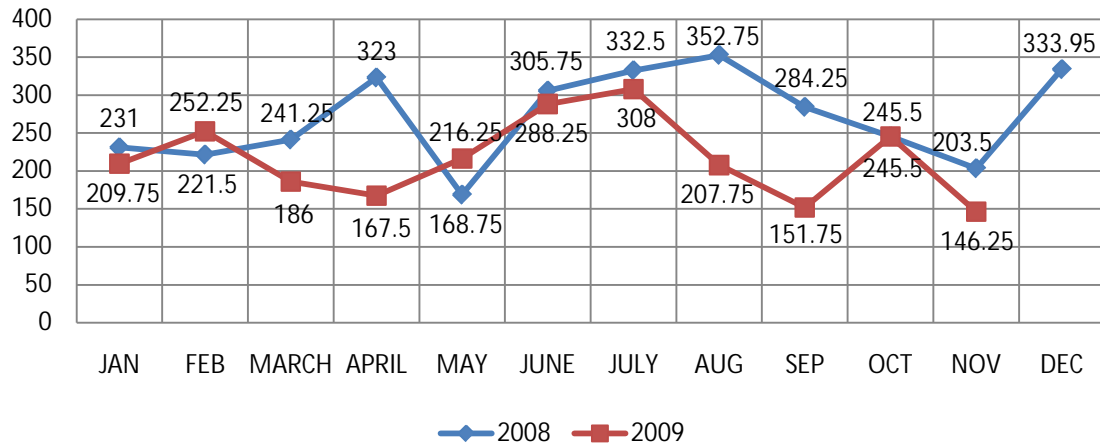
4.) ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES

7.) CASES OF INTEREST THIS MONTH.

- ◆ 11-01-09, felony charges of operating a motor vehicle without owner's consent were filed against a 17-year-old Hartford man after he admitted to taking the vehicle from a parking lot in the 600 block of E Monroe Av., driving it to Waukesha, and then ultimately to Pewaukee, where he was taken into custody.
- ◆ 11-21-09, a 19-year-old Hartford man was cited for possession of drug paraphernalia after an investigation at the scene of a traffic stop lead to the discovery of a mag light flashlight that had been hollowed out and had holes drilled in it. The flashlight was covered with a residue which had a strong odor of burnt marijuana.
- ◆ 11-21-09, a 28-year-old Hartford man was arrested for outstanding warrants. During the search incident to the subject's arrest, a \$10 bill fashioned as an envelope was recovered from his person. Inside this bill was a white chalky substance which tested positive for cocaine. The cocaine weighed .68 grams. Charges of possession of cocaine have been forwarded to the Washington County District Attorney's Office.
