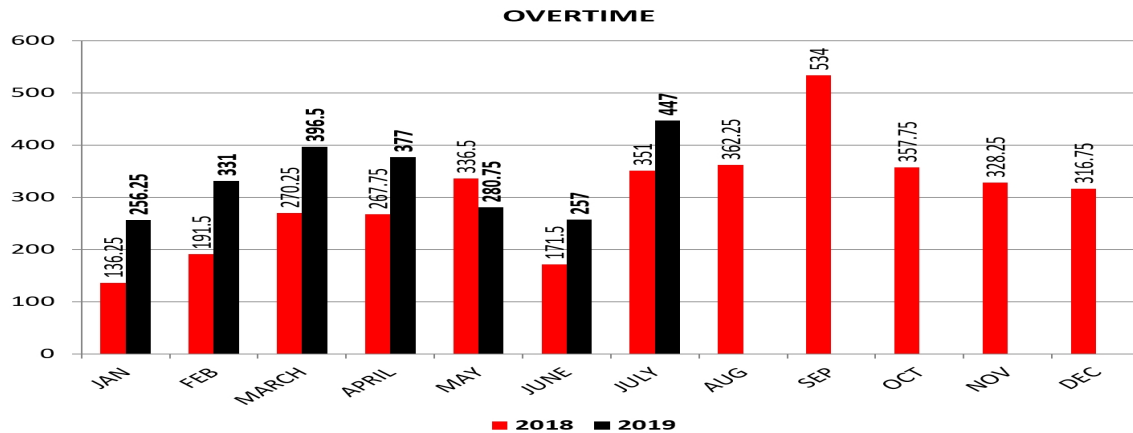
4.) **ANTICIPATED PROJECTS/TASKS/ACTIVITIES**
