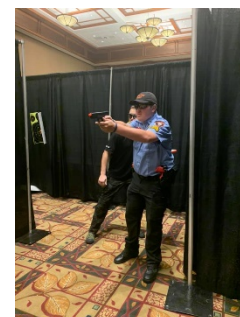

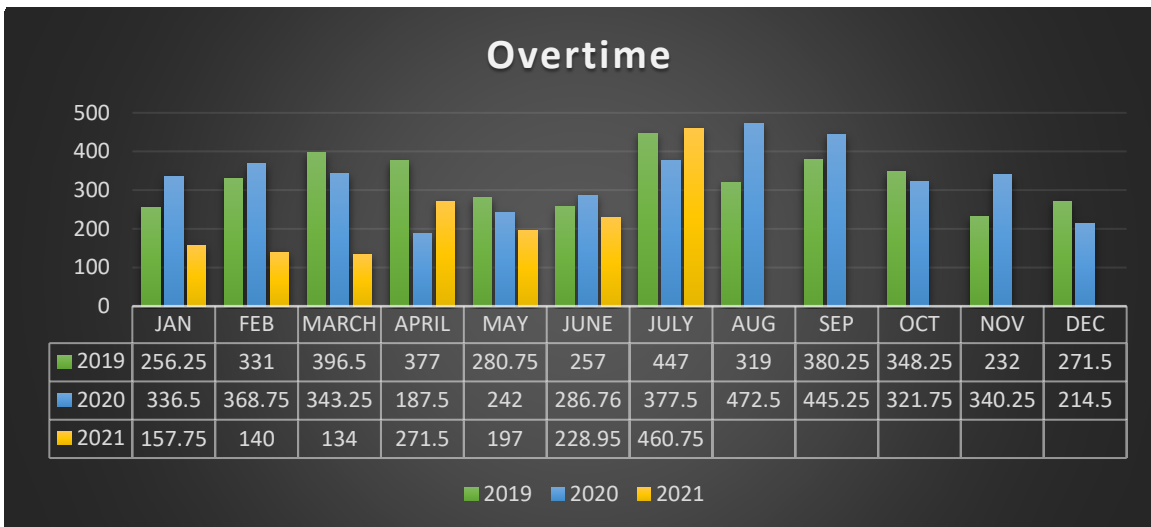

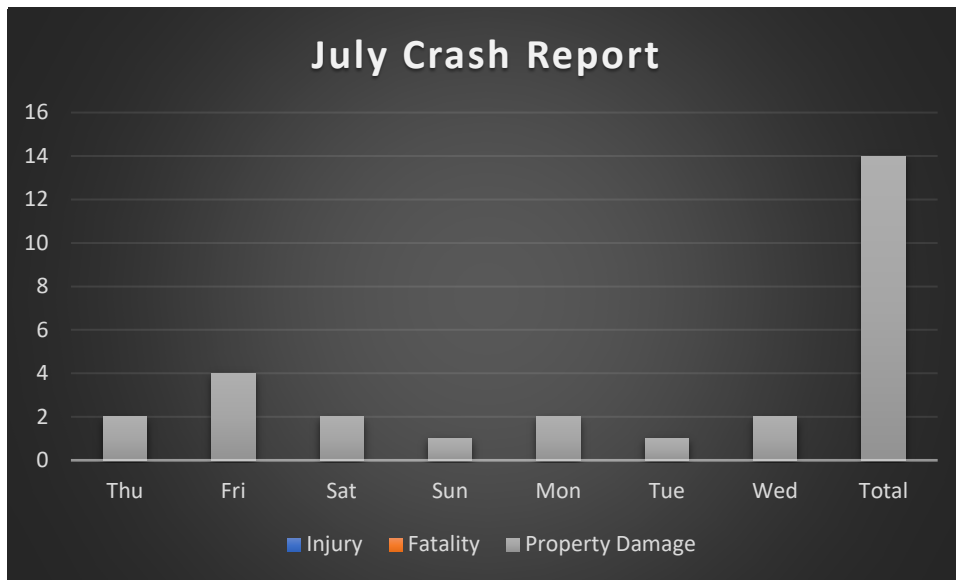

4.) OVERTIME



The month of July saw an increase in overtime versus the previous two years. There were several reasons for this. The first, and most significant, was the unexpected resignation of one of our full time communications officers. The resulting shift vacancies were filled with overtime. We are currently in a recruitment process to hire a replacement for the C.O. that resigned. Another contributing factor to the increase in overtime was an increase in calls for service that required increased manpower. We experienced several fire and SWAT calls that required additional staff. Finally, the Hartford Public Safety Cadets attended a National Competition in Tennessee. Two of our police officers (mentors) went along to guide and supervise the group. This is a fantastic opportunity for the youth in this program to put their skills on display in a competitive environment. Most of the costs associated with this program are offset by donations and fundraisers.

5.) JULY VEHICLE CRASH REPORT



During the month of July, officers investigated 16 fewer vehicular crash incidents than the previous month. In June, officers responded to 6 personal injury crashes, and 24 property damage related crashes. Of the 14 crashes officers responded to in July, all of them were property damage related. They occurred on every day of the week with Friday being slightly higher than other days.
