The process of accreditation takes three years to prepare for. We strive to be an organization to operate on at a high level pursuing professional standards of ethics and integrity.

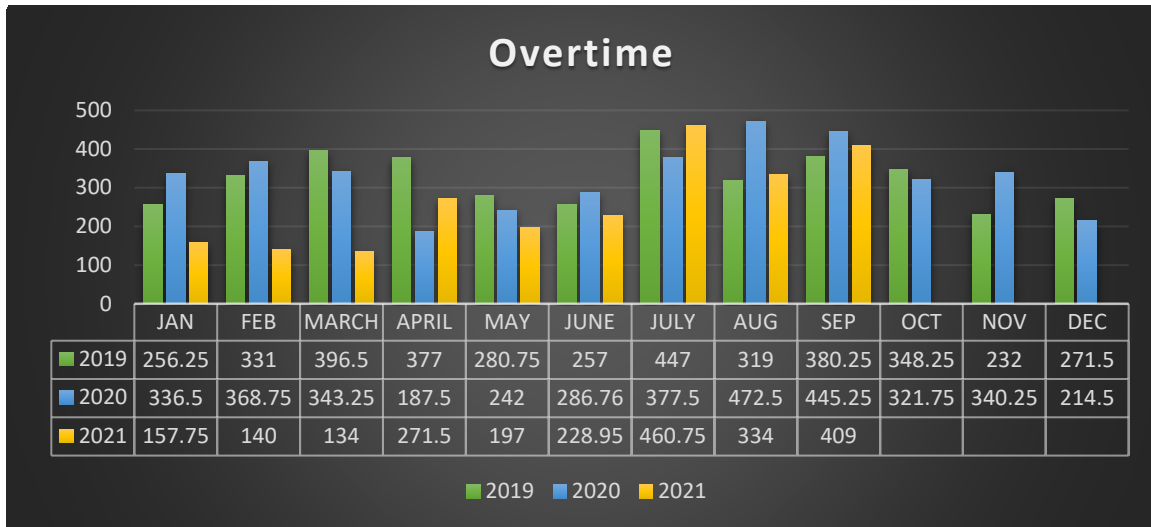

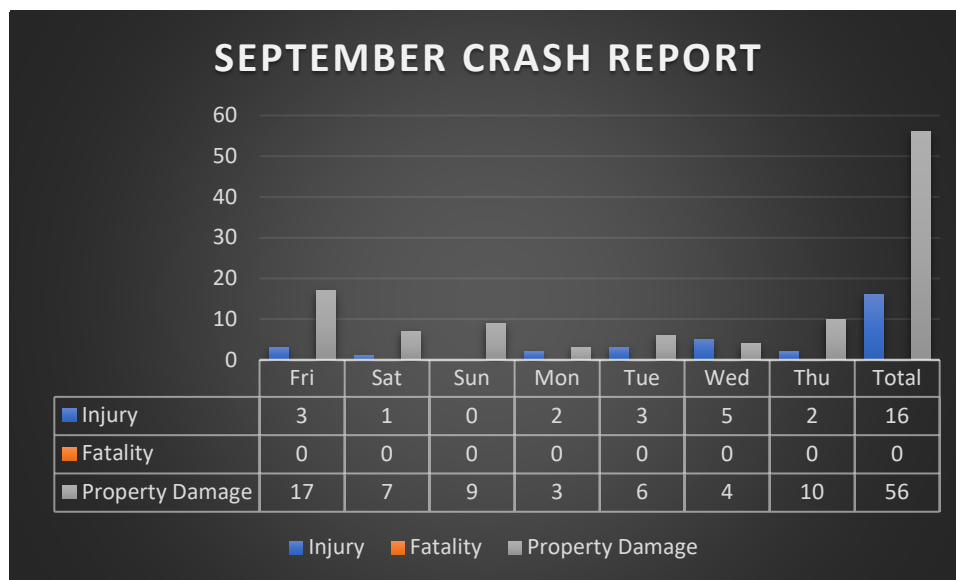

5.) **SEPTEMBER VEHICLE CRASH REPORT**



During the month of September, officers investigated forty nine additional vehicular crash incidents than the previous month. Forty one of those were personal injury related. In August, officers responded to 8 personal injury crashes, and 15 property damage related crashes. They occurred on every day of the week with Friday being significantly higher than other days for property damagerelated crashes.
